Genesis 43

Genesis 43.1-10

- <u>V1</u> What was Jacob's decision at the end of *Chapter 42*? They would not return to Egypt for more grain
 - -What might cause them to change their minds? If they were about to starve to death
- <u>V 2</u> The grain they brought back eventually was used up
 - -What did Jacob ask? For them to go back and get more grain from Egypt
- <u>V 3</u> What did Judah say? They had better not go back without Benjamin
- <u>V 4</u> The deal made according to Judah? We will go if you will let us take Benjamin
- <u>V 5</u> Without Benjamin, they would not go they had been solemnly warned by Joseph
- <u>V 6</u> What did Jacob complain about? "Why did they have to tell him about Benjamin?"
- <u>V 7</u> **How did the brothers answer Jacob?** "How were we supposed to know what he was going to say? He had just asked a lot of strange questions"
- <u>V8</u> If they don't send Benjamin, what will happen? They will all starve to death
- <u>V 9</u> What did Judah offer? To be personally responsible for Benjamin and guarantee he would return
- <u>V 10</u> Judah's comment? We have wasted too much time

Genesis 43.11-15

- <u>V 11</u> **What did Jacob suggest?** That they take some presents for the Egyptian ruler spices and rare foods from the land of Canaan
- <u>V 12</u> What else were they to take? Double the amount of money for more grain and the money that had been placed in their sacks
 - -"Maybe it was a mistake"
- V 13 Was Jacob going to allow Benjamin to go? Yes
- <u>V 14</u> What would Jacob be praying for? That God would give compassion to the Egyptian and allow Simeon and Benjamin to return home
- <u>V 15</u> They got everything together and left for Egypt

Genesis 43.16-25

- V 16 Joseph's attitude toward his brothers? A little kinder
 - -What did he order? Animal killed, meal prepared
- <u>V 17</u> Where were the brothers taken? To Joseph's house
 - -This would have been very unusual
- <u>V 18</u> Why did the brothers think that Joseph had invited them to his house? Still mad about the money in the sacks planned to kill them at his house
- <u>V 19</u> Who did the brothers speak to? To the steward of Joseph's house (valet, caretaker, waiter, servant, etc.)
- **V 20** They started telling their story
 - **-Why would they tell their story to the steward**? Maybe he could break the news to Joseph in kinder terms than they could
- <u>V 21</u> The story of finding the money in their sacks
- <u>V 22</u> They did not know who put the money in their sacks
- <u>V 23</u> The reaction of the steward? "Calm down, I put the money in your sacks"
 - -They had just proven that they were honest men
 - -Simeon was brought out
- <u>V 24</u> What courtesies were shown them? Their feet were washed, and the donkeys were fed
- <u>V 25</u> What presents were they going to give Joseph? The spices, etc., from Canaan

Genesis 43.26-34

- **V** 26 The brothers presented the gift to Joseph
- <u>V 27</u> What did Joseph ask? How their father was doing (still alive, etc.?)
- <u>V 28</u> Answer? Our father is doing well
 - -They bowed down to Joseph (the third time)
- <u>V 29</u> Who did Joseph see? His brother Benjamin
 - -Message to Benjamin? May God be gracious to you...
- <u>V 30</u> Why did Joseph start crying? Tears of joy (at least 13 years more like 20 since he had seen him)
 - -Joseph left the room crying

- <u>V 31</u> He got himself under control, and the meal started
- <u>V 32</u> Three groups of people eating Egyptians and Semitic (Hebrews) and Joseph (by himself)
 - -An example of racial prejudice? Egyptians did not want to eat with Hebrews
 - -Racial prejudice is not just a matter of black and white problems

<u>V 33</u> – How were the brothers seated? In order of birth

- -It looked as if Joseph had them seated this way on purpose
- -They were "astonished" at this
- <u>V 34</u> What else was unusual about the meal? Joseph gave Benjamin five times what others got to eat

Lesson:

-The brothers were honest about the money – when a person is dishonest, he eventually gets caught (tripped up)
