Acts 10

Acts 10.1-8

- **V1** Centurion (leader of 100 men)
 - -See *Luke 7.1-5* Jesus healed the servant of the centurion (this centurion had built a temple for the Jews)
 - -Acts 27.1-43 A centurion of the Augustan band saved Paul's life
 - -Matt. 27.54 The centurion who was standing at the foot of the cross said about Jesus, "Truly this was the Son of God"

V 2-3 - 4 characteristics of Cornelius?

- 1. A devout man
- 2. Feared God with all his household (a good father)
- 3. Gave many alms to the Jewish people
- 4. Prayed to God continually
- -Most denominational churches today would have welcomed Cornelius in as a good member
- -What about Gentiles before the gospel of Christ?
- -See *Romans 2.14-16* They could be saved by observing good moral standards and the law of the heart (for example, the Code of Hammurabi, 1700 BC in Babylon)
- $\underline{V4}$ Similar to whom? Paul (Acts 9.5)
 - -Why wasn't Philip called (he was already in Caesarea Acts 8.40)? Because it was the Apostle Peter who was given "the keys of the kingdom"
 - -In other words, Peter was the one to welcome in the Jews in Acts 2 and the Gentiles in Acts 10 into the kingdom of God
- <u>V 5</u> **What did the angel tell Cornelius to do?** Send some men to the city of Joppa and find a man name Simon, also called Peter
- <u>V 6</u> Where was Peter staying in the city of Joppa? In the house of a tanner named Simon -What does this tell us about Peter's "revised" view of the Law of Moses? Tanning was
 - forbidden by the Old Law as being unclean
 -The local tanner had to practice his work outside of town, so as not to corrupt the whole town
 - -So Peter was being prepared for the vision that was about to take place
- <u>V 7</u> **How did Cornelius respond to the instructions of the angel?** He prepared two servants and a "devout" soldier to leave for Joppa
 - **-How could this soldier be described as being "devout"?** According to the Patriarchal Age (See *Romans 2.28-29* God's law for the Gentiles before the coming of the New Covenant in *Acts 2*) -See *Galatians 3.29* spiritual Jews, as opposed to racial Jews
- <u>V 8</u> What did Cornelius tell these men before they left? All that had happened and why they were being sent to Joppa

Acts 10.9-16

- -Read Deut. 14.3-8ff unclean animals under the Law of Moses
- $\underline{V9}$ How was Peter able to pray on the roof? It was a flat roof
- <u>V 10</u> What happened as Peter was getting ready for breakfast? He fell into a trance (Greek word for "ecstasy")
- <u>V 11-12</u> What did Peter see in the vision? A sheet with "unclean" animals on it -Where in the Old Testament do we read about unclean animals (that the Jews were not supposed to eat)? Leviticus 11
- <u>V 13-14</u> Why did Peter not want to see these animals? Unclean animals -Had Peter ever eaten unclean animals in his life? Never
- <u>V 15</u> What great lesson did Peter learn from this vision? That we are not to call anything that God made as unclean
- <u>V 16</u> Why did God give Peter this vision three times? To make sure that he got the message!

Acts 10.17-23a

- <u>V 17</u> Good education disturbs the equilibrium of the student That is what God was doing for Peter
 - -What people did the Great Commission apply to? All creation, all the world
 - -Did the early Christians obey that commission? Not at first
 - -It took persecution in Acts 8 to get them out of Jerusalem
- <u>V 18</u> What did the men ask about? If Peter was staying there
- <u>V 19</u> Luke is showing here that God was directing things, not just chance
- <u>V 20</u> Explain "without misgivings" Peter was not to doubt what was taking place
- <u>V 21</u> **What question did Peter ask?** For what reason have you come here?
- <u>V 22</u> Their answer? An angel appeared to our master Cornelius and asked to hear a message from you
- <u>V 23a</u> What was the response from Peter to these men? He gave them hospitality for the night (a place to stay)

Acts 10.23b-34

- V 23b His brethren? Some of them were Jewish converts (v 45 circumcised)
- <u>V 24</u> Significance of friends and relatives? A good man, with much influence
- <u>V 25</u> **Should men be worshipped?** Remember Paul and Barnabas at Lystra **Read Acts 14.11-15** -**How do people worship men today?** Holy Father, Reverend, Father, priest, etc.

- **-Should angels be worshipped?** *Revelation 22.8-9* absolutely not
- <u>V 31</u> **Does God hear the prayer of the unrighteous person?** *John 9:31* The blind man who had been healed
 - -This shows the humility of Cornelius (rare among most people)
- <u>V 32</u> A retelling of the final details of the trip
- <u>V 33</u> What was so great about this audience? They were all waiting and sitting and ready to hear the word of God preached to them

Acts 10.34-43

Notice: Peter's sermon was short!

- **-How does this sermon compare with Stephen's sermon?** Much shorter, with fewer references to the Old Testament)
- **-Why were there fewer references to the Old Testament?** Because Cornelius was not a Jew and had very little background in the Old Testament
- <u>V 34</u> The lesson that Peter had learned? Not to call any man or woman unclean (unworthy of the offer of salvation)
- <u>V 35</u> Who is acceptable to God? Any person who fears God and does what is right -Is it possible to fear God and yet not do what is right? Yes Jonah was in that category
- <u>V 36</u> Whom had God the Father send to preach to the Jews? His son Jesus Christ
- <u>V 37</u> What immediately preceded the coming of Jesus as the Christ? John the Baptist and his baptism (he was to prepare the way for the coming of the Messiah)
- <u>V 38</u> What characteristics did Peter give concerning Jesus Christ?
 - 1. He was anointed by God and the Holy Spirit
 - 2. He went about doing good
 - 3. He healed all those who were oppressed by Satan
 - 4. God was with him
- <u>V 39</u> What had Peter witnessed about Jesus Christ? The things that he did in the land of the Jews and in Jerusalem, and the crucifixion of Christ on the cross
- <u>V 40</u> What was the final proof from God that this was his son? The resurrection of Christ from the dead on the third day
- <u>V 41</u> How did the apostles know that Christ had truly been raised from the dead? He had eaten and drunk with them (he was not a ghost or some kind of spirit)
- <u>V 42</u> What a verse! **What orders had Christ given to his disciples?** To preach the gospel and to warn people that a Day of Judgment was coming (for the living and the dead)

Acts 10.44-48

- <u>V 44</u> The Holy Spirit was given to the Gentiles
- <u>V 45</u> What was the reaction of the Gentiles who heard this message? They were amazed that the gospel of Christ was being offered to them also
- <u>V 46</u> What was evidence of this offer of salvation to the Gentiles? Speaking in foreign languages and praising God
- <u>V 47</u> **Is Peter calling for a vote?** No, he is asking a rhetorical question (a thought question that does not require an answer)
 - -What is the answer? Of course, not no-one can forbid a penitent sinner from being baptized
 - -Note: In some denominational churches [example: Baptist], the congregation takes a "vote" to accept a person into the church (based on this verse), but that is not the message here, and, besides, their "vote" is only ceremonial
- <u>V 48</u> **Why did Peter not baptize any of them?** For the same reason that Paul did not want to baptize people at Corinth **Read 1 Corinthians 1.14-17**
 - -He did not want a group of people to start following him, instead of Christ

Lessons from this chapter:

- 1. There is to be no racism in the presentation of the gospel of Christ -V 28 The gospel is for all people
- 2. They had to accept the message of Peter and be baptized, in order to be saved
